Samba Band Club

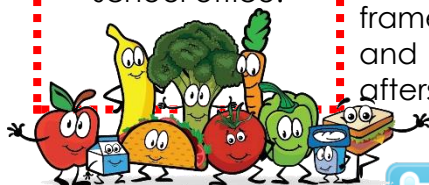
We still have some spaces left in the Samba Band Club on Wednesdays for years 3 – 6. Please ask at the Office for my information.

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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 08/01/16

Reception	<p>Next week in literacy Reception will be reading Jack and the Beanstalk and planting beans. We will also be writing instructions on how we planted them. We will be enjoying discussing traditional tales and making props for displaying around the classroom. In Maths we will be learning about length and the value of zero. As usual we will be cooking something delicious! Happy New Year! The Reception Team.</p>
Year 1	<p>Happy New Year! We hope that you all had a restful holiday.</p> <p>Literacy – Recount of tour of school. Focusing on using time connectives (such as First, Next, Then, After, Finally) to sequence events.</p> <p>Maths – To use number bonds within 10 to add or subtract a 1-digit number to a 2-digit number, to apply knowledge of number bonds to 10 when subtracting and to explore addition or subtraction bridging ten.</p> <p>Science – Naming and sorting materials – thinking about their properties.</p> <p>Creative/DT – Exploring a variety of materials, <i>e.g. papers, fabrics and plastic packaging</i>. Talking about which materials are suitable to make a model fire engine.</p> <p>Topic - Our topic this half term is <i>The Great Fire of London</i>. This week we will be investigating what London was like in 1666.</p> <p><i>We will be making model fire engines this half term. Could you send your child in with a medium sized plastic fruit/mushroom container so they can make their own engine. Thank you.</i></p>
Year 2	<p>Julie’s Language and Literacy group will begin to write their own play scripts. Christina’s Literacy and Language group will be beginning to write their own poems using the techniques they have been exploring. In Maths Mastery we will continue to look at multiplication and division. We are going to go on a material hunt around the school for our Science topic ‘Uses of everyday materials’. We begin looking at the life of Rosa Parks and the difference she made in History. In Computing children will continue to code using Espresso. In Art we will be looking closely at drawing buildings through a viewfinder. Don’t forget book bags every day and children need their P.E kits for P.E on Tuesday and Wednesday.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths - Addition and Subtraction with up to 4 digits: The children will be using rounding to estimate for calculating. They will also be adding and subtracting two 3-digit numbers using the column method.</p> <p>English- Folktales: The children will be planning and writing their own folktale.</p> <p>Science - We will be introducing our new topic of Forces and Magnets.</p> <p>Topic - Our focus this week will be describing the main Celtic Tribes.</p> <p>P.E. - Please ensure your child has their PE kits on Wednesdays and Thursdays.</p> <p>Reminder: All children must have their library book (in the plastic wallet) at school on Tuesdays.</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: This week we will be plotting coordinates and translating shape.</p> <p>English: We will be studying the composition of play scripts and exploring drama.</p> <p>Topic: Our topic of Ancient Greece will lead us to the Trojan war.</p> <p>PE: Thursdays and Fridays for BOTH Classes. <u>Some children are still not bringing an appropriate change of kit for these lessons. Please ensure that PE kit is provided.</u></p> <p>This is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p>Homework: Homework will be given out on Fridays. Please encourage your child to complete homework and return it on Wednesdays. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects. Handwriting and times tables also need to be practised for short bursts each day.</p> <p>TRUMPET & CLARINET : This will continue to take place on Tuesday afternoons for Picasso Class and on Thursday afternoons for Sekoto Class.</p> <p>TRIP: There will be a year group trip to The British Museum on 20th January.</p> <p>Please return the slips and sign the back of the form if you would like to accompany us.</p>
Year 5	<p>Happy New Year to all parents, carers and children!</p> <p>Maths: Year 5 are now in three groups;</p> <p><i>Ms Edgar:</i> Solving word problems involving negative numbers and consolidating methods for written subtraction, including decimals.</p> <p><i>Ms Beckles:</i> Adding numbers with up to 4 digits using the formal written method.</p> <p><i>Mr Sharman and Mr Mattocks:</i> Practising and using the 6 x table. Finding fractions of shapes and placing them on a number line.</p> <p>English: We will continue to write a story from a character’s perspective.</p> <p>Science: We will be exploring Moon landings and the impact that they had on the world.</p> <p>Topic: We will finish planning a local walk.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p>Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>
Year 6	<p>Maths - fractions and decimal equivalents.</p> <p>English - continuing to write a persuasive argument.</p> <p>Topic - investigate how tornadoes form and the impact they have on people and communities.</p> <p>Science - study the classification of animals.</p> <p>PE/Swimming will take place on a Friday afternoon. Please ensure your child brings the appropriate kit.</p>
