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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 14/03/16

Reception	<p>Next week in Reception we will be learning about Pablo Picasso and painting our very own 'Woman with a Hat.' In Literacy the children will be writing out rhyming words inspired by the book 'Rumble in the Jungle'. In Maths we will be learning our number bonds to 5 and doing addition within 10. Cooking club continues as usual. Please remember that parents' evenings are next Monday 14th and Wednesday 16th March. We look forward to seeing you all there. Have a great week! The Reception Team.</p>
Year 1	<p>Literacy: Poetry – Rhythm and rhyme: We will be reading a variety of poems linked to our topic. We will be thinking about how rhythm, rhyme and repetition are used. The children will have a go at writing their own verse for a poem.</p> <p>Maths: We will be comparing the lengths of two objects using non-standard units of measurement. We will also introduce standard units of measurements.</p> <p>Topic: In science we will be gathering and recording data on plant growth.</p> <p>Art: In art, we will be looking at the work of Andy Goldsworthy and designing our own sculptures using natural materials from our school environment.</p> <p>PSHE: We will be talking about what makes us feel proud and being able to tell when are proud. Please remember next Friday is Sports Relief Day! (Can your child dress in red please)</p>
Year 2	<p>Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will be making a booklet about being healthy. Cheryl RML group will be practising their phonics in their reading and writing. In Maths Mastery we will continue to look at fractions. In Science we will be finding out about the different food groups and the importance of eating healthily. In Geography we will continue to design our own map using a grid reference. In Computing children will continue to develop their skills in coding. We need all children to bring their book bags every day. Please ensure all reading books are in the book bag every day. P.E kits as always on Tuesday and Wednesday.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: The children will be using the grouping model of division. They will also be using known facts and place value to multiply a 2 digit number by 3, 4 or 5.</p> <p>Literacy: Instructional Texts - We will be looking at the key features of instruction texts and using these to write our own set of instructions.</p> <p>Science: This week we will be investigating how water is transported within plants.</p> <p>Topic: The journey of food - from field to plate.</p> <p>PE: A large number of children do not have their PE kits at school for our PE lessons. Please ensure your child has their kit in school every Wednesday and Thursday.</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: We will exploring how we use numbers (negative numbers, numbers beyond 1000, solving number problems).</p> <p>English: We will be studying non-fiction writing and looking at key features of newspapers.</p> <p>Science: We will be investigating sound and how it travels to us.</p> <p>Topic: We will be studying the topic of the Roman Empire.</p> <p>PE: Thursdays and Fridays for BOTH Classes. Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p>TRUMPET & CLARINET: This will continue to take place on Tuesday afternoons for Picasso Class and on Thursday afternoons for Sekoto Class. <u>Please help your child to remember to bring their instruments on the first week back.</u></p> <p>Homework: Homework will be given out on Friday. Please encourage your child to complete homework and return it on Wednesday. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects. Handwriting and times tables also need to be practised for short bursts each day.</p>
Year 5	<p>Maths: Year 5 are now in three groups; <i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will continue to read, write, order and compare numbers with up to 3 decimal places. <i>Ms Beckles:</i> We will be adding numbers mentally. <i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will start to explore the properties of 2-D shapes.</p> <p>English: We will consider how characters and settings affect a story.</p> <p>Science: We will explore different types of forces.</p> <p>Topic: We begin a new topic on Alaska and we will start by locating it on a world map.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p>Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p> <p>Parents' Evenings: Are taking place on Monday (14/03) and Wednesday (16/03). All slots are now allocated online. If you have not been able to allocate yourself a time, come and talk to either of us and we can arrange a time with you. We look forward to meeting you all!</p>
Year 6	<p>In Maths the children will continue to practise with SATs questions and address any areas they find challenging. In English the children will be exploring how writers develop characters through actions, speech, descriptions and thought. In science the children will be exploring the human body focussing on the blood. Booster sessions now take place three times per week in preparation for the SATs in May.</p>
