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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 22/02/16

Reception	After half term in Reception we will be learning about number and pattern. We will be reading 'The Snail and the Whale' by Julia Donaldson and creating our very own snail pictures inspired by Henri Matisse. We will also be making salt dough snails. In Maths we will be learning about ordering numbers to 15 and about one more and one less within 15. Cooking will continue as usual and we hope you have a fantastic half term break! The Reception Team.
Year 1	Our new topic will be The Great Outdoors. Literacy: Poetry – We will be looking at alliteration and creating our own animal alliteration poems. Maths: Addition and subtraction within 40. We are adding and subtracting ones or tens without regrouping, adding using regrouping when necessary and adding two 2 digit numbers without regrouping. Topic: Introduction to <i>The Great Outdoors</i> topic; Discussion about the four seasons and then a walk around the school grounds looking for signs of spring. The children have worked really hard this half term! We hope that you all have a relaxing holiday.
Year 2	Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will be comparing books by the same author and exploring blurbs. Cheryl RML group will be practicing their phonics in their reading and writing. In Maths Mastery we will start to look at money. We will focus on the value of coins and notes and compare their value. In Science we start a new topic 'Animals including Humans'. In Geography we will start to look at grid references. In Computing children will develop the skills they have been learning in coding to make their own programs. We need all children to bring their book bags every day. Please ensure all reading books are in the book bag. P.E kits as always on Tuesday and Wednesday.
Year 3	Maths: The children will be using known facts to solve multiplication and division problems. Literacy: <i>Mystery Stories</i> - We will be exploring how authors create suspense and mystery in stories. Science: Our new topic this half term is <i>Helping Plants Grow</i> . We will begin by investigating the parts of a plant. Topic: We will be introducing our new topic - <i>Where does our lunch come from?</i> We will focus on the food we eat, where and how it is grown and how it reaches our table.
Year 4	Maths: This week we will be identifying angles (acute, obtuse, right angle). English: We will start exploring stories with a historical setting. Science: We will learn about the water cycle and its patterns. PE: Thursdays and Fridays for BOTH Classes. Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement. TRUMPET & CLARINET: This will continue to take place on Tuesday afternoons for Picasso Class and on Thursday afternoons for Sekoto Class. <u>Please help your child to remember to bring their instruments on the first week back.</u> Homework: Our Greek project is to be completed during the next two weeks and due in on Wednesday 1 st March. Each child is asked to make a model on any aspect of the Ancient Greece topic e.g. Greek dress (men, women, soldiers, and slaves), homes, 3D map of Ancient Greek vases, the Trojan horse etc. There will be no other homework. GREEK DAY: Thank you for your generous donations of food and helping the children to dress up for our Greek Day. They were fantastic! We all had a lovely time!
Year 5	We wish all parents/carers and children a peaceful half term! Maths: Year 5 are now in three groups; <i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will continue to use the formal written method of short division to solve problems. <i>Ms Beckles:</i> We will be adding and subtracting numbers up to four digits using the formal written method. <i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will recap formal methods of addition and subtraction and begin to explore decimal numbers. English: We will begin to write a biography of Anthony Horowitz for the back cover of one of his books. Science: We will explore the life cycle of an amphibian. Topic: We will investigate the Maya religion and how this impacted on their lives. PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits. Homework: No homework has been set for half term. Project: A reminder that the date of submission for the project is Monday 29th February.
Year 6	Maths - Next term we will be focusing on constructing 2-D shapes using given dimensions, angles and measuring tools. English - To plan and write a persuasive letter. Topic - Our focus for the following half term will be medicine. Science - Animals, including humans. During the half term can you please encourage your child to use the website SATs Boot Camp, read every day and practice multiplication facts for quick recall.
