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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 16/05/16

Reception	Next week in reception we will be reading the story 'The Bad Tempered Ladybird' by Eric Carle. In Maths we will be learning about the properties of 2-D shapes and looking at the months of the year. We will be talking about the life-cycle of a plant and children will be cooking and gardening as usual with parents. Please ensure that your child comes to school with a book bag plus the yellow reading book so that books can be changed regularly. Thank you. Have a great week! The Reception Team.
Year 1	<p>Literacy: Non-fiction Texts – The children will be continuing their work on Information texts. They will be planning and writing information pages for a class book about plants. We will be discussing the style in which information sentences should be written. The children will also be writing captions for pictures, as well as creating their own glossary of plants words.</p> <p>Maths: We will apply our knowledge of number bonds within twenty, we will be adding three 1 digit numbers and finding the missing part in an equation.</p> <p>Topic: The children will be researching plant facts for their information writing.</p> <p>Science: We will be identifying and naming trees by their leaves.</p>
Year 2	Year 2 will be continuing with their SAT's assessment during the mornings of next week. During this time children also be making a clay tile, creating a safari collage and a flower patchwork with wax crayons. In Science we will be looking at the life cycle of a plant. In Geography we be preparing for our trip to the zoo. In computing we will continue to look how to make a PowerPoint presentation. Please ensure all reading books are in the book bag every day. P.E kits as always on Tuesday and Wednesday.
Year 3	<p>Maths: This week, the children will begin a new unit on 'Angles'. They will be investigating right angles within everyday objects/shapes and learn about acute and obtuse angles.</p> <p>English: The children will continue their work based on Non-Chronological Reports and begin writing their own reports based on our topic, Ancient Egypt.</p> <p>Science: The children will undertake an experiment to investigate and identify the different features of rocks.</p> <p>Topic: We will be learning about the discovery of the tomb of Tutankhamen!</p> <p>REMINDERS: PE kit is needed on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Our Spelling Challenge takes place every Friday. Homework is due back to school by Wednesday.</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: We will be interpreting and presenting data using graphs.</p> <p>English: We will identify the features of instructional texts and explore the vocabulary used.</p> <p>Science: We will consolidate our work on Sound.</p> <p>Topic: We will study how the Romans lived and a typical Roman villa.</p> <p>PE: Please note the change of day to Wednesday and Friday for BOTH Classes. Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p>Homework: It is vital that your child learns ALL tables to x12. <u>This will help considerably with their maths calculations. Learning tables on a daily basis in short burst (10-15min) is a successful strategy. Children have been given a times tables sheet to help them. Please encourage them to use it.</u></p>
Year 5	<p>Maths: Mr Mattocks: We will be converting capacities. Miss Whight: We will be converting masses. Mr Sharman: We will be exploring different ways to solve problems involving subtraction. Mental and formal methods.</p> <p>English: We will be continuing to explore persuasive writing.</p> <p>Science: We will look at levers, pulleys and gears and the effect they have on forces.</p> <p>Topic: We will begin a new topic on rivers.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p>Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>
Year 6	<p>A big congratulations to year 6 for working so hard during the SATs week. We know they have all tried their very best and we are extremely proud of them!</p> <p>English – We will be looking at the works of Michael Morpurgo and exploring the use of dialogue in narrative writing.</p> <p>Maths – Extending understanding of algebra by solving number problems and satisfying equations.</p> <p>Art – Exploring how artists convey movement and developing techniques for drawing figures.</p>
