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# NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 18/04/16

<b>Reception</b>	<p>Next week in reception we will be planting sunflowers and continuing with our interest in how plants grow. In Maths we will be learning about measuring length, weight and capacity. In literacy we will be writing out plant instructions and in expressive arts and design we will be creating our own seed plates. Cooking club will continue as usual this term. We would be really grateful if parents could contribute £3 for the summer term towards the cost of ingredients. It is not compulsory but any contribution would be much appreciated. We are also starting a GARDENING CLUB next week. We require a parent from each reception class to help us with the reception garden from 1.30pm to 2.15pm on a Friday. A list will go up and it first come first served. Thanks you! The Reception Team.</p>
<b>Year 1</b>	<p><b>Literacy:</b> This week we will be using The Man on the Moon, by Simon Bartram to write descriptions of our own aliens.  <b>Maths:</b> We are comparing the capacity of 2 or 3 containers using non-standard units, we will compare different volumes and use mathematical vocabulary to describe them.  <b>History:</b> We will be comparing the lives of rich and poor Victorians.  <b>Science:</b> We are identifying and naming a variety of common plants.  <b>RE:</b> We are looking at celebrations and how people celebrate the important events in their lives. Please remember PE is on a Monday and Thursday and book bags every day.</p>
<b>Year 2</b>	<p>Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will be looking at what is needed for persuasive writing. Cheryl's RML group will be practicing their phonics in their reading and writing. In Maths Mastery our topic is time, we will look at o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to if you want help your child at home. In Grammar we will be focusing on sentence types: statements, commands, exclamations and questions. We will be planting seeds of different sizes in our Science topic 'Plants'. In our History lesson we will look at the Notting Hill Carnival celebration. In computing we will continue to handle data. Please ensure all reading books are in the book bag every day. P.E kits as always on Tuesday and Wednesday.</p>
<b>Year 3</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> We will be continuing our unit on Time. The children will be measuring, matching and estimating intervals in seconds and minutes.  <b>English:</b> The children will be planning, writing and editing their own adventure story based on Flat Stanley.  <b>Topic:</b> Our new topic is The Egyptians. We will be finding out about the different ways in which Ancient Egyptians lived and worked.  <b>Reminder:</b> Please ensure P.E. kits are in school for Wednesdays and Thursdays.</p>
<b>Year 4</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> We will be working on division and solving problems using times tables.  <b>English:</b> We will be exploring a story from another culture, studying characters and the details of the plot.  <b>Science:</b> We will continue to work on pitch and volume in our Sound topic.  <b>Topic:</b> We will explore the Roman invasion of Britain and the legacy.  <b>PE:</b> Please note the change of day to <b>Wednesday</b> and Fridays for BOTH Classes. Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement.  <b>Homework:</b> Please encourage your child to learn <b>ALL</b> tables to x12. <u>This should be done on a daily basis in short burst (10-15min).</u> This will help considerably with their maths calculations.</p>
<b>Year 5</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> Year 5 are now in three groups;  <i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will be adding and subtracting five and six-digit-numbers.  <i>Ms Beckles:</i> We will be ordering fractions.  <i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will be finishing looking at measurement and scales and then begin to explore the different types of angles.  <b>English:</b> We will be writing a non-chronological report.  <b>Science:</b> We will identify the effects of air resistance and water resistance.  <b>Topic:</b> We will discuss features of Anchorage and southern Alaska.  <b>PE: Monday and Tuesday.</b> On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.  <b>Homework:</b> Will be given on <b>Monday</b>, to be handed in on <b>Friday</b>.</p>
<b>Year 6</b>	<p>The children in year 6 are working hard in preparation for the SATs which start on 9th May. In maths we will be revising various areas, including fractions, symmetry, algebra and ratio and proportion. In English we will focus on narrative writing, developing comprehension skills and the use of quotations to justify an opinion. As the SATs are so close, it is important that the children practise areas of literacy and maths that they are less confident in. They can log in to SATs BOOT CAMP user: campsbourne password: best school. Please ensure that your child has the correct kit for PE and/or swimming on Friday.</p>
