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# NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 23/05/16

<b>Reception</b>	<p>Next week reception will be reading Peter Rabbit stories and growing lettuce in our gardens to complement the carrots and onions. In <b>literacy</b> we will be continuing to explore mini-beasts and write about our favourite ones. In <b>expressive arts and design</b> we will be painting healthy and less healthy foods and in <b>maths</b> we will be learning about the properties of 3-D shapes. Cooking and gardening clubs will continue as usual. Have a great week! The Reception Team.</p>
<b>Year 1</b>	<p><b>Literacy / Science:</b> <i>Letters</i> - The children will be looking at how a letter is set out. They will be planning and writing a letter to order various types of flowers from a garden centre. We will be discussing the features of a letter, how it should start, the information we need to include and how to end our letter. The children will also use their knowledge of flowers to use as key words in their writing.</p> <p><b>Maths:</b> The children will be adding or subtracting a 2-digit number and ones or tens, exploring addition strategies and continuing to develop their use of bead strings, Dienes and jottings.</p> <p><b>Art / History:</b> We will be using our 'Victorians' topic to help us to make an art piece for the Crouch End Festival.</p>
<b>Year 2</b>	<p>Year 2 will be continuing with their SATs assessments during the mornings of Monday and Tuesday. During this time children will also be completing their work with clay tiles, safari collages and flower patchwork with wax crayons. In Science we will be observing the differences in growth in the plants we put in different locations. In Literacy and Geography we be discussing our visit to the zoo. In computing we will continue to explore how to make a PowerPoint presentation.</p>
<b>Year 3</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> The children will continue to develop their knowledge about 'angles'. They will be identifying pairs of lines that are perpendicular, drawing a line that is perpendicular to a given line and identifying pairs of lines that are parallel.</p> <p><b>English:</b> The children will complete their Non-Chronological Reports this week (based on our topic, Ancient Egypt).</p> <p><b>Art:</b> This week the children will investigate art and toys from the 1950s with a focus on Jackson Pollock. Some of the artwork created during these lessons will be used for the Crouch End Art Festival and displayed in the Town Hall.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Please remember to provide your child with a PE kit every Wednesday and Thursday.</p> <p><b>WE NEED PARENT HELPERS ON THURSDAY 9TH JUNE FOR A LOCAL TRIP - PLEASE LET THE YEAR 3 STAFF KNOW IF YOU ARE AVAILABLE</b></p>
<b>Year 4</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> We will be calculating the perimeter and the area of rectangles.</p> <p><b>English:</b> We will complete our writing on instructional text and write a new episode for our story 'Sugarcane Juice'.</p> <p><b>ART:</b> We will be creating a piece of art about Street Games in 1960s for the Crouch End Art Festival.</p> <p><b>PE:</b> Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p><b>Homework:</b> It is vital that your child learns <b>ALL</b> tables to x12. This will help considerably with their maths calculations. <b><u>Learning tables on a daily basis in short burst (10-15min) is a successful strategy.</u></b> <b>Children have been given a times tables sheet to help them. Please encourage them to use it.</b></p>
<b>Year 5</b>	<p><b>Maths:</b> <i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will be exploring percentages of amounts. <i>Miss Whight:</i> We will be looking at square and cube numbers. <i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will be re-visiting fractions, including finding fractions of quantities.</p> <p><b>English:</b> We will investigate famous myths and discuss their features.</p> <p><b>Science:</b> We will look at what type of trainer best provides friction.</p> <p><b>Topic:</b> We will identify the major rivers in the United Kingdom.</p> <p><b>PE: Monday and Tuesday.</b> On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p><b>Homework:</b> Will be given on <b>Monday</b>, to be handed in on <b>Friday</b>.</p>
<b>Year 6</b>	<p><b>Maths</b> - Using compasses and protractors to construct a variety of shapes and complex patterns.</p> <p><b>English</b> - We will continue to explore themes and analyse the use of language within Michael Morpurgo's 'I Believe in Unicorns'.</p> <p><b>Topic (Art)</b> - We will continue to study and practise the numerous approaches and techniques used to create movement in art.</p>
