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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 25/04/16

Reception	<p>Next week in Reception we will be reading The Hungry Caterpillar and discussing different habitats. Children will create their own houses using collage and paints. In Literacy we will be sequencing the story of the Hungry Caterpillar. In Maths, we will be learning about grouping and sharing. Please sign up for gardening club if you are available on Fridays between 1.30pm – 2.15pm. Have a great week! The Reception Team.</p>
Year 1	<p>Literacy: Poetry – We will be looking at a variety of poems based around the theme of The Night Sky. The children will be hearing, reading, responding to and performing poems. They will then go on to compose lines of their own poems using similes.</p> <p>Maths: We will be recognising, reading and writing numbers to 100, finding groups of tens and ones in numbers within 100 and representing numbers using a number line and a 100 square.</p> <p>Science: We will continue to identify and name a variety of common plants.</p> <p>History: We will find out about the type of music Victorian children might have listened to.</p> <p>P.E.: We will continue to work on improving our jogging and running skills. Also, we will develop and improve our knowledge and understanding of team games.</p> <p>As the weather gets warmer, the children will need a sun hat and a t-shirt which covers their shoulders and neck. The children will also need to drink more water. Please take to talk to your child about how important this is.</p>
Year 2	<p>Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will be writing character description that they will use to write a story. Cheryl's RML group will be practicing their phonics in their reading and writing. In Maths Mastery we will continue with time, looking a 5 minute intervals. In Grammar we will be focusing on using speech marks and commas. In Science we will be looking at what plants need to grow. In our History we will look at May Day celebrations. In computing we will continue to handle data using 2Graph. Please ensure all reading books are in the book bag every day. P.E kits as always on Tuesday and Wednesday.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: We will be starting a new unit of work on Fractions. The children will be identifying the number of equal parts in a whole. They will learn to name and write unit fractions, as well as finding a fraction of a given quantity.</p> <p>Literacy: The children will begin a unit of work on Persuasive Writing. They will be exploring the key features of these types of texts.</p> <p>Science: Children will complete an investigation of the functions of the different parts of a plant and order the life cycle stages of a plant.</p> <p>Topic: We will continue to find out more about life in Ancient Egypt and what was important to people during these times.</p> <p>*Parent helpers: On Thursday 28th April, both Year 3 classes will be going on a local walk as part of a workshop with Thames Water. These will run in the morning. We will need several extra adult helpers for each class. If you are able to help, please talk to your class teacher. Many thanks in advance.</p>
Year 4	<p>Maths: We will be working on length and converting between kilometres and metres</p> <p>English: We will be exploring a story from another culture, studying and describing characters.</p> <p>Science: We will continue to work on pitch in our Sound topic.</p> <p>Topic: We will explore the Roman invasion of Britain and Boudicca.</p> <p>PE: Please note the change of day to Wednesday and Fridays for BOTH Classes. Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p>Homework: it is vital that your child learns ALL tables to x12. <u>This should be done on a daily basis in short burst (10-15min).</u> This will help considerably with their maths calculations.</p>
Year 5	<p>Maths: Year 5 are now in three groups;</p> <p><i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will be exploring properties of rectangles to find missing lengths and angles.</p> <p><i>Miss Whight:</i> We will be looking at translation of shapes.</p> <p><i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will continue to work on our understanding of angles, including using key facts to solve problems. Also, we will begin to work out the factors of a given number (less than 50).</p> <p>English: We are looking at how poets use language in their poems.</p> <p>Science: We will investigate a range of forces.</p> <p>Topic: We will examine the culture of Alaska.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p>Homework: Will be given on Monday, to be handed in on Friday.</p>
Year 6	<p>The children have been working extremely hard but still need to remain focussed as we only have nine school days to go before SATs! In English we are continuing with revising the features of narrative and non fiction texts and developing our skills in finding evidence to support answers. In maths we shall continue to practise SATs based questions and focus on key areas of concern.</p> <p>We are pleased to inform you that we have two student teachers with us, Miss Malone and Miss Ramsey. They will be working alongside us until half term and then they will be taking a lead role until the beginning of July</p>
