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NEXT WEEK ACTIVITIES FOR CAMPSBOURNE!

Week Beginning: 26/09/16

Nursery	<p>The children have got off to a fantastic start to their year and have all settled happily. Well done!</p> <p>This week we will be welcoming our last intake of new children and making a start on our topic 'Nursery Rhymes' with a focus on the tragic tale of Humpty Dumpty.</p> <p>We would be grateful for contributions of Junk modelling materials (clean recyclable packaging) for general use in our workshop area.</p>
Reception	<p>Next week in Reception we will be talking about our families and creating our own pictures of our families for a display (Expressive arts and design). Reception are looking forward to participating in a listening walk around our grounds as part of phase one phonics. In Maths we will be learning about repeated patterns and using the interactive whiteboard as part of our learning. Reception children are going to be choosing a book this week to share with their parents/carers so we encourage you to make sure they have a book bag to take home their book. Thank you to all parents for their help in settling in their children and we wish you a lovely week! The Reception Team.</p>
Year 1	<p>Literacy: Narrative (Stories with familiar settings): We will be reading <i>I am absolutely too small for school</i> (By Lauren Child) and discussing times that we have felt nervous or anxious about something. We will be making links to PSHE and our New Beginnings theme. The children will be writing sentences about a time they felt nervous or anxious - focusing on using the connectives 'because' and 'and' to extend our ideas.</p> <p>Numeracy: The children will be recognising that numbers can be split into more than 2 parts, finding half or double and continuing to use the part-part-whole model.</p> <p>Science: Children will understand that humans are animals. They will talk about the similarities between animals and humans. In Art we will be creating Self Portraits in the style of Matisse.</p> <p>Please remember Year 1 children line up in the playground in the mornings at 8:50am and are collected by their class teacher. Also, Homework folders need to be returned.</p>
Year 2	<p>Maths: The children will begin a new unit on adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers. This week they will be exploring number bonds within 20.</p> <p>Literacy: We will be continuing our work on The Papaya That Spoke. The children will be exploring how the author has written the story and developing their understanding of the vocabulary used. We will be identifying the key features of a 'journey' story. Please support your child to orally retell the story using the story map provided.</p> <p>Science: Next week the children will be comparing and exploring the differences between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive.</p> <p>Next week we will be celebrating European Languages Week. Year 2 will be learning about Greece.</p>
Year 3	<p>Maths: Children will continue applying their knowledge of number bonds to add and subtract numbers. They will also be investigating different ways to represent addition and subtraction problems.</p> <p>Literacy: Children will continue learning about 'Nail Soup' and will role play the main characters in the story.</p> <p>Science: Next week, children will be comparing and grouping animals by their diet.</p> <p>Topic: Children will be investigating which tools and weapons were used during the Stone Age.</p> <p>PE: Please ensure children bring their PE kits weekly on Wednesdays and swimming kits fortnightly on Fridays. Please support your children with regular reading, spellings and times table practice.</p>
Year 4	<p>English - We will be using story maps and drama to explore the folktale of 'Nail Soup'.</p> <p>Maths - Well will be deriving mathematical facts and using the partitioning method to calculate.</p> <p>Science - We will be looking at types and functions of teeth.</p> <p>Topic - We will be looking at the origins of democracy from ancient Greece.</p> <p>P.E. - Both Picasso and Sekoto need to bring in their P.E kits on Friday.</p> <p>Swimming - Classes will swim on alternate Mondays, Sekoto will be swimming this Monday.</p>
Year 5	<p>Maths: The children will be solving addition and subtraction problems.</p> <p>English: We will be rewriting a story map of 'The Canal'.</p> <p>Science: We will be investigating a life-cycle of a plant.</p> <p>Topic: We will research key dates and events in the Anglo-Saxon period.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday - all children need to bring their PE kits every week.</p> <p>Swimming: Every other Tuesday – the teachers will inform the children when to bring their swimming kits. Next week's swimming is Lowry.</p> <p>Homework / Spelling: <u>To be handed out on Monday and needs to be returned on Friday.</u> Please encourage your child to complete homework and hand it in on time. Reading daily with your child and discussing the text will aid their progress in all subjects.</p> <p>Parents Meeting: This is taking place on Tuesday 27th September at 3.45pm. We look forward to meeting you all!</p>
Year 6	<p>In maths we will be focusing on mental strategies for addition and subtraction including and solving multi step problems.</p> <p>In English we will be continuing with our work on describe settings using chapters from Lemony Sniket series of books.</p> <p>Please remember to attend our year six meeting on Thursday 29th September at 3:45pm in Kahlo classroom, we look forward to meeting you.</p>
