| Reception | Next week in reception we will be reading the book 'What the Ladybird Heard' by Julia Donaldson. In literacy we will be exploring maps and creating our own den complete with torches and under the table exploration. In maths we will be learning about money and creating our own shop. We will also be growing cress from scratch, with a view to eating it in sandwiches later in the term! Cooking and gardening clubs will continue as usual. Have a great week! The Reception Team |
| Year 1 | <p>Literacy: Fantasy Settings – We will be reading <i>The Way Back Home</i>, by Oliver Jeffers. The children will be sequencing the story events, thinking about the beginning, middle and end. We will be exploring character feelings through hot-seating and role-play activities. The children will then plan and write their own story ending.</p> <p>Maths: We will represent numbers as groups of ten and ones in a place value chart, recognise one more/one fewer and ten more/ten fewer and compare numbers within 100.</p> <p>Science/Art: We will be identifying and describing common flowers. We will then do some observational drawings of flowers we find in the playground.</p> |
| Year 2 | Julie and Christina's Literacy groups will use their character descriptions for a superhero story. Cheryl's RML group will continue to practise their phonics in their reading and writing as they prepare to join Julie or Christina's group. In Maths Mastery we will be adding ones then tens to 3-digit numbers, using the column method. In Grammar we will be focusing on apostrophes for possession. In Science we will be looking at what happens to plants in different locations and under different conditions. In Geography we will start to look at what animals you might find on a safari. In computing we will continue to handle data using 2Graph. Please ensure all reading books are in the book bag every day. P.E kits as always on Tuesday and Wednesday. |
| Year 3 | <p>Maths: We will be comparing fractions, learning how to write non-unit fractions and also begin investigating strategies to solve fraction word problems.</p> <p>Literacy: The children will use their knowledge of persuasive features/devices to plan and complete a persuasive letter.</p> <p>Science: Children will begin a new unit of work which will involve investigating 'Rocks and Soils'.</p> <p>Topic: We will continue to find out about what life was like in Ancient Egypt by learning about the ritual of mummification.</p> <p>***A reminder that school will be CLOSED to children on Monday, 2nd May and Thursday, 5th May.***</p> |
| Year 4 | <p>Maths: We will be learning to interpret and present data using graphs.</p> <p>English: We will be describing the journey a character takes in our story from another culture, studying setting and the character's emotions.</p> <p>Science: We will continue to work on pitch in our Sound topic and what happens when sounds reach the ear.</p> <p>Topic: We will explore how the Britons resisted Roman invasion with their leader and Boudicca.</p> <p>PE: Please note the change of day to Wednesday and Fridays for BOTH Classes. Please ensure that PE kit is provided as this is a health and safety requirement.</p> <p>Homework: It is vital that your child learns ALL tables to x12. This will help considerably with their maths calculations. <u>Learning tables on a daily basis in short burst (10-15min) is a successful strategy.</u> Children have been given a times tables sheet to help them. Please encourage them to use it.</p> |
| Year 5 | <p>Maths: Year 5 are now in three groups;</p> <p><i>Mr Mattocks:</i> We will be recognising mixed numbers and improper fractions.</p> <p><i>Miss Whight:</i> We will be adding whole numbers using the formal written method.</p> <p><i>Mr Sharman:</i> We will be exploring negative numbers.</p> <p>English: We will be exploring different forms of persuasive texts.</p> <p>Science: We will explore the properties of air resistance.</p> <p>PE: Monday and Tuesday. On Monday, the children require both their swimming and PE kits. On Tuesday, the children just need their PE kits.</p> <p>Homework: Will be given on Tuesday, to be handed in on Friday.</p> |
| Year 6 | During the last three days before the SATs, we will be revising key areas of grammar and comprehension. In maths the children will focus on problem solving and applying their skills and strategies. The student teachers will be working with groups of children on the final week of their topic looking at Islamic art. As the children are off school on Monday and Thursday, we have given them a CGP pack for English and Maths to work through during next week. Please encourage your child to complete these. The packs contain a mark scheme so you can mark them with your child. |
